im and Gail Spann discovered the world of minerals quite by accident. They had wandered into a museum and stumbled upon a dark hall filled with brightly lit crystals, each one leaving them amazed.

That evening, Gail googled the word "Wulfenite" after scribbling it on a napkin with an eyeliner pencil—the only writing tool she had in her purse.

Both Jim and Gail quickly found online resources and auctions, where they began bidding on minerals. They loved everything they won, and soon enough, they were hooked! Before long, they were sponsored to join the Mineralogical Association of Dallas (MAD).

As their collection grew, so did their desire to volunteer on numerous boards and committees, including assisting with the development of the Perot Museum of Nature and Science.

Now, after 19 years, their collection numbers over 20,000 specimens. Expanding their home by 9,000 square feet became a necessity as their 72 cabinets filled up quickly.

Not only do the Spanns collect fine minerals, but they also have an impressive assortment

of rarities and specimens from type localities.

Both Jim and Gail serve on the Hudson Institute of Mineralogy, which operates *Mindat.org*, and they are actively involved with museums, frequently loaning minerals at no cost.

They also host educational tours at their home near Dallas, Texas, and invite local non-profits to hold board meetings, followed by a guided tour of their collection.

Their enthusiasm remains constant as they continue to collect pieces that bring them joy in their hobby. The couple often gives talks, with audiences appreciating both Jim's perspective and Gail's—

although Gail insists hers is the correct one, while Jim just shakes his head.



Since 2007, BlueCap Productions has been traveling the world capturing some of the most important mineral

Ongoing projects are currently concentrated throughout the Weardale valley in County Durham, UK; the Rogerley and Diana Maria mines being the only active professional specimenproducing Fluorite mines in Europe.

At present (October 2024), 34 pockets have been discovered and named

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
